I was ecstatic but my excitement was soon tempered by the bitter reality that I could not afford it. Lurking behind the acceptance letter was an invoice for \$4,450 plus an additional \$550 for travel/expenses. I knew immediately that neither I nor my parents had this money. In fact, my parents had just sent my older brother to college and all of our extra finances are still tied up in that. As I read on it seemed my Junior Statesmen dreams were slipping away. I have until May 18th. It seems impossible but what else can I do but give it my all.

I tracked down the numbers to old friends and acquaintances, relatives, everyone I knew and began making calls. Explaining my situation and the urgency of my need has become second nature. Monday morning, three days ago, I set up a conference with my principal, vice-principal, and the school's college counselor. I told them my situation and asked if I would be able to raffle donated items at the school. Their responses were doubtful because conducting personal fundraisers at my school is something that has never been allowed on an individual basis. Slightly discouraged, I tracked down Robert Reffkin's number and urgently requested to speak with him. I met Robert in the fall at a Goldman Sachs Leadership Development Institute event, where he talked about the tenants of success, of determination, of love and of pride in one's work. He told us emphatically to "find the questions that our lives were meant to answer". It is that question which encouraged me to apply to Junior Statesman of America.

Last night I spoke with Robert and he agreed to forward a form letter to some potential sponsors. This is that letter. My need is urgent; the avenues I have pursued prior to this have yielded nothing. To attend I must raise the full \$5,000. Anything you can donate would be greatly appreciated. I promise that any investment you make in me will not be wasted. I have big dreams and will work as hard as I can to realize them, not just for myself but for my community.
